QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS from HaRav Avigdor Miller zatza"l

Q: Every year, before Rosh Hashana comes along, I a kabalah, "I'm going to keep quiet. I won't answer back." It's a make kabolos about improving myself in various areas of my service of Hashem. But here I am, the same schlepper I've always been.

A: Let me tell you something. You're not the same. Don't think you're the same. You're getting worse! As time goes on עבר אדם עבירה . ושנה בה נעשית לו כהיתר - "One who does a sin, and then repeats it again and again, it becomes permissible in his eyes" (Yoma 87a). So if you're not improving, you're getting worse.

When you make a kabalah bli neder you have to have something

specific; at least one specific thing that you're going to work on changing. תפסת מרובה לא חפסת - If you try to grab too much at one time, you're going to grab nothing at all. It's all going to fall out of your hand. To say in general, "I'm going to be good this year," is better than nothing, but not much better.

You have to specify something clearcut. Say, "This year, no matter how mean my wife is to me, and how much she'll bother me and criticize me and nag me, I won't say anything impolite to her. I'll keep my mouth closed." That's already something specific, something you can grab on to. תפסת מועט תפסת. It's something limited, something that you can grab onto.

And actually, even though it's something specific, it's not so small in Hashem's eyes. The possuk says על בלימה - "The world hangs on nothing" (Iyov 26:7). And Chazal tell us that it means the following: אין העולם מתקיים אלה בשביל מי שבולם פיו בשעת מריבה - "The world exists only on account of the person who keeps his mouth closed at a time of provocation" (Chulin 89a). The zchus, the merit, of keeping your mouth closed when people are insulting you is a very big zchus. So start with your wife. You can start with somebody else as well. Let's say you have an employer who insults you, keep quiet. You want to keep your job don't you? So keep your mouth closed. Make

tremendous thing to do that.

So you have to pinpoint it, something clearcut. And then you'll be able to carry it out. Don't talk in general. General means nothing at

Let's say you want to daven with kavana. You can't just say, "This year, I'm going to daven with kavana." It's too much to grab onto at once. Make up your mind that you're going to fight to get that first bracha. Every word in מגן אברהם - that first bracha you're going to get down clearly. And don't let go of it. Hold on to it. תפסת מועט תפסת. Take a little bit at a time and hold on to it. תפסח, means that

you're holding on to it. Hold on to that little bit very tightly. Let's say you made a kabalah to learn Torah. So don't say, "I'm going to start learning more seriously this year." It's too big, too vague. Do it like this: "Bli neder, I'm going to learn fifteen minutes every day no matter what." And then, do it. Learn every night, fifteen minutes; it's better than nothing. At home, fifteen minutes. No matter what! Take out a sefer and learn for fifteen minutes. You want to learn an hour, very good, I'm not stopping you. But every night, learn fifeeen minutes. Or go to a shiur every night. That's even better. Every night no matter what. That's a kabalah that's a דבר שיש בו ממש, it's clear-cut, it's something you can sink your teeth into.

Now even though sometimes there's so many more things that you should be doing as well, that you're not doing, but at least there's one thing you are doing. And Hashem sees that you're headed in the right direction. And if you're headed in the right direction then הבא ליטהר מסעיין אותו - If you're trying to get better, He'll help you go further and further" (Menachos 29b). But you have to at least do one thing! And then you'll get siyayta dishmaya to do more and more. TAPE E-157 (September 1998)

As I stand here only days before my dear mother's first yahrzeit, I ers, but she chose to believe that each bullet had its address and G-d am reminded of a reflection and a difficulty that resurfaces time and again. I could not as a youngster and still cannot as an adult wrap my mind around the tremendous differences between my mother and me. I know what I thank G-d had at 16 and I know that she lost almost everything at that age. Her power of belief in G-d and great strength of character allowed her to endure the overwhelming challenges in her life.

As a young woman during the Holocaust she hid with her family in forests and farm houses of sympathetic Poles. There was a ninemonth period that she hid in a hole in the ground only to come out on moonless quiet nights. She heard the boots and the dogssof Nazis when she was in basements and open fields desperately holding her breath, but her heart couldn't be stilled.

She would find out later that one Polish family was executed a day after she and her family left their farm house because of a rumor that they harbored Jews. And the worst was when her father took her to find water and they separated from the rest of the family, then returned only to find that her beloved mother and only sister, who was 11 years old, had been murdered. How can one go on? The word "loss" is pitifully inadequate to describe the utter devastation of her life because of the war.

Loss would come again in the form of a sick husband for 10 years, a sick beloved son for 11 years and the early demise of a sweet, sweet grandson. My mother cried plenty but davened to the Alm-ghty as a true daughter of Israel throughout these unbearable challenges. She saw the remarkable strength of her father, the only grandparent I knew, who at that tragedy covered over his wife and daughter with his bare hands, using dirt from the blood drenched soil of Poland. He allowed himself to cry only at night, away, or so he thought, from his precious daughter, my outstanding mother.

It was a lesson she never forgot, and indeed she didn't share her experiences and emotions with us only until her later years, knowing full well that uncontrolled sadness would lead to a depression that few would be able to subdue. Fifty years later she

in His mercy saved her, sometimes in the form of wind that blew her scent away from ferocious German dogs. She always felt that G-d continued to watch over her. This is summed up with 12 Hebrew words on her elegantly worded monument.

"An abundance of belief and trust she had for the times of sorrow with the sacrifice of her mother and sister before her eyes and the loss of her precious son."

How obvious that even during G-d's wrath His great compassion was evident to her not only in sparing her but allowing her to thrive throughout her life as a magnificently productive, respected and cheerful daughter, wife, mother and friend, even while she carried such a dark past.

It's not only this strength that's beyond my comprehension but all the positives of her life. The beautiful and unassuming way she did so much kindness. The mothering of girls from the Beth Jacob school that she undertook when her four sons left home. Girls who would call her even years after their marriage. The generous hospitality to so many.

Once, when she stayed in the hospital with her father on his last Shabbos on earth, she first prepared the meals for her guests and had my youngest brother stay home with them.

Her dedication to the welfare of the most important institutions of Denver, Hillel Academy, Yeshiva Toras Chaim, Beth Jacob, the Shul and the Mikveh was exceptional. She could be counted on for any of their affairs and functions. Only one thing she would desire — no

She sponsored a young woman from Morocco whom she helped develop into a fine person and eventually walked her down to her chuppah. She would send her and her children money and clothing for decades after they moved to Israel. Again, only one request no fanfare.

The purity of her heart attracted so many to her. Women would want to sit next to her in shul realizing her devotion and extraordinary prayers. She was among the first to arrive and even told me that she could understand those who didn't remain believ- after she moved to Cleveland its ice and snow would not deter her.

that were always used; only rubber bands would be able to keep the wrinkled, tear-soaked pages intact.

She had a deep-seated, long-term relationship with the Alm-ghty. Once a grandchild asked her if she was lonely living for 15 years by herself in her home in Cleveland after her husband died. Her response was very matter of fact, "What do you mean alone, G-d is with me?"

My mother was almost paranoid about one thing —someone else's feelings.

She was careful with her speech not to offend anyone and showed special respect to the mailman, cleaning lady and young children. Her extreme sensitivity for others revealed the exquisite heart she developed. Her business dealings were beyond reproach, and she even looked to make peace with those who were not ethical with her. This too was summarized on her monument in 10 Hebrew words:

"The integrity of her ways and her meticulous honesty were her glory. And she adhered carefully to the honor of everyone.'

I am truly fortunate and I'm so appreciative to G-d for my mother. She was so supportive of me and my brothers. She seemed to live only for her husband and father and us. She was selfless throughout her life; there was no ego. Her incredible self-sacrifice, allowing and supporting each of her four sons, whom she adored, to leave home and travel to yeshivas thousands of miles away was remarkable. never forget her tears, mixing with mine as I said goodbye when I was 13. Her respect for my father and her father was legendary — there was nothing she wouldn't do for them. In

Her Psalms and prayer book at home were full of names and notes my father's later years she would feed him three times a day when he couldn't do so himself. This would take hours daily, and when done she would still spoon feed him the hot tea that she knew he

> Throughout my life I can testify that I never heard her complain or noticed any sense of bitterness. When my father died she made my brothers and I promise not to say anything during his eulogy about her sacrifices. She said, "I only did what spouses are expected to do."

> My mother's first thought was what someone else needs, and in that spirit every envelope for tzedakah that came across her desk was opened and answered. Every drive to the shopping area was preceded by a call to women who had no transportation. Every Shabbos didn't begin before she delivered food to an elderly woman who was alone.

> My mother was a queen without any fanfare, dignified, forever cheerful, adorned with humility. She never stopped growing spiritually. She went to virtually every Jewish education class available in Cleveland even at 90, feeling that she needed to make up for a missed childhood. She of course would drive others even on her last day.

I loved her to pieces and I'm overwhelmed by her loss.

May she fully enjoy reuniting with those she loved and cherished, and delight in the reward given to those most special souls.

"May she be bound up in the everlasting bond of life."
