

מטעמי פרשה פרשת ויגש Parsha Delight Question

On his way to מצרים, Yaakov Avinu stops in נאר שבע, and the possuk (46:2) states, ויאמר יעקב לישראל במראת הלילה, ויאמר, יעקב, ויאמר הנני. Hashem said to Yisroel in visions of night, and He said, Yaakov Yaakov, and he (Yaakov) said, "Here I am". If in this context, he is to be referred to as Yisroel, as indicated by the beginning of the possuk, then why does Hashem call out to him with the reference, Yaakov, Yaakov? Why not - Yisroel, Yisroel?
