



A Message from the Board

Dear Members,

Like most of us on the West Side, the Shul's roof received extensive damage and needs to be replaced. B"H the insurance company has agreed to replace the Shul roof. However, according to code, the insulation on the shul roof can no longer be flat, but must have a slight slope to drain the water. The problem the Shul runs into is when you add pitch to the roof it leads to the rooftop A.C. units on the roof being too low and therefore the units must be lifted off the roof by a crane and the stands raised and the units repositioned back on the roof. B"EH the insurance company will pay for this to happen.

While we could just reinstall all the current units we have, 3 of the units are on their last legs. The one in the Ezras Noshim no longer produces heat, and two more units will not last much longer. It would be the most economical to replace 3 units while the insurance is paying for the cranes and save the future cost of having to hire a crane.

The cost of three new units is approximately \$25,000. Once we are doing new units, it would be fitting to finally put a proper unit into the Rov's office so that the Rov could have proper quiet and efficient heating and air-conditioning. It would also be beneficial to explore cooling in the kitchen during the summer months. It would be nice to only bake items in the ovens, not those trying to bake them.

The shul B"H, under the leadership of the Rov, has created many wonderful programs during the year which the Shul does not charge to attend. There is also the weekly Kiddush and winter Shalosh Seudos, which when not sponsored the costs add up very quickly.

The Shul has depleted most of its reserve funds and once we are engaging the membership in a capital campaign drive it would make sense to simultaneously raise fund for programming. The board has set the target amount at \$50,000.

Attached are pledge forms for members to fill out to pledge to help us raise our goal. The pledges can be spread out over time. We ask all to pledge what they can with the idea of paying them over the next two years. For example: If one were to pledge \$50 a month for two years, such a pledge would go greatly towards reaching our goal.

מטעמי זרע אברהם פרשת וישלח

Last Week's Question:

אנם הלך לקראתך וארבע מאות איש עמו, And he (Esav) is also heading toward you (Yaakov), and four hundred men are with him (32:7). Is there a reason why Esav chose to bring specifically 400 people? Why not more? Why not less? And if indeed the number 400 is significant, than why didn't he bring 399 men, which together with Esav himself is 400? Why would he need 401?!

Answers Received:

• 400 men is a standard number for a troop of men. In Shmuel Aleph Perek 22 Posuk 2 it states that David HaMelech gathered that many men וויתקבצו אליו כל איש מצוק וכל איש אשר לו נשא וכל

איש מר נפש ויהי עליהם לשר ויהיו עמו כארבע מאות איש. Similarly, there in Perek 25 Possuk 13 it states, ויאמר דוד לאנשיו חגרו | אירי דוד איש את חרבו ויחגר גם דוד את חרבו ויעלו | אחרי דוד So, we see that this is a standard number for a group of soldiers, with a general to lead them.

• In Parshas Lech Lecha (15:13) Hashem tells אברהם אבינו his offspring will be enslaved for 400 years. וויאמר לאברם ידע . דע כי גר יהיה זרעך בארץ לא להם ועבדום וענו אתם ארבע מאות שנה Esav was volunteering to be the "nation" to enslave the בני , and fulfilling the 400 years through these enslavement and torture by these 400 men.
