מטעמי פרשה פרשת וישלח Parsha Delight Question

נגם הלך לקראתך וארבע מאות איש עמו, And he (Esav) is also heading toward you (Yaakov), and four hundred men are with him (32:7). Is there a reason why Esav chose to bring specifically 400 people? Why not more? Why not less? And if indeed the number 400 is significant, than why didn't he bring 399 men, which together with Esav himself is 400? Why would he need 401?!

A Message from our friends, Dr. and Mrs. Mordechai and Rachel Mishory

It is our turn now to express our hakaras hatov to the West Side Denver community that has nurtured us for 26 years, to grow as bnei Torah, as human beings, and as a family. We came to the kehilla on a psak: the psak was to move to Denver, to the West Side. We asked the Rabbonim why specifically here and they said because in Denver you will be needed. We believe with a full heart that this psak was not just for and about us; that everyone who moves to this kehilla has the same opportunity. Each one of you is needed and that is why it is so special to live here. Each one of you has important parts of yourself to contribute to the klal and that is the real reason you are here. We are eternally grateful to have had the opportunity to contribute for 26 meaningful years and we leave a kehilla that is far stronger than it was when we came; also let us share with you the other part of the psak we received: why this kehilla? The Rabbonim said because there (in Denver-on the West Side) they know they are not yet in Olam Haba. We have always understood that to mean that this community is as precious to the Ribbono shel Olam as it is precarious: the Ribbono shel Olam keeps constant watch on it. And so, while you are now stronger than anyone imagined possible, your work is not done, you are needed, and we urge you to put your unique kochos to the service of continuing to build this kehilla. May the work of your hands be blessed as we have been blessed by having been part of your history.
