#### Ezras Tzedakah

When a collector, particularly one whom you do not know well, presents himself without an approval certificate from Ezras Tzedakah, it is a red flag. It is a good idea to ask him why he does not have one. Ishurim from other cities should not be accepted, as the individual's need is constantly re-evaluated each time a collector applies for a certificate. A certificate that is expired should not be accepted.

Please also bear in mind that the approval system of Ezras Tzedakah also serves as a way

through which collectors can be held accountable. When applying for a certificate the collector signs his agreement to the following: Not to use the approval certificate after the valid dates; that the certificate may not be transferred to another collector; that he only collect for the purpose/institution stated on the certificate; that he treat all with respect, and accept even a small amount with a smile;

that he may not collect in a Shul during Krias Shema and its Berachos; and that he may not solicit funds after 10:00 p.m. and that he not make copies of checks. Infractions are grounds for confiscation of the approval certificate, and reporting to the national databases. Currently, there is an individual in Denver who is collecting without a certificate, and indeed would not receive one of he were to apply –

caution should be exercised.

#### Securtiy Tip

It is a pleasure to see our children enjoying the new playground. We have a combination lock on the front door for security but it only works when the door is fully closed. Please insure your children know to close it all the way.

Although we have this extra measure of security, there is always the possibility that the wrong people can walk in if the gate is left open or while a child is going in and out. We still need to continue having all doors the Shul closed at all times to insure the safety or our members inside the Shul.

Please note: There has been a woman trying to gain access to our playground by asking a young child to open the gate. This may be an innocent occurrence; however, given previous experiences, this is more likely a fanatic wanting to gain access to the shul.

#### TAG Alert

It is strongly recommended not to upgrade your phone to the new iOS 12. This alert applies to all that have an iPhone/iPad and are using one of our FREE filtering options.

Many Apple devices (iPhones/iPads) are currently receiving an automatic official update for the newer Apple iOS version 12. Due to many changes Apple has implemented in this update, we

discovered that unfortunately the update can cause issues to the filtering settings & in some cases leave the device unfiltered. We advise NOT to accept this update until further notice. In addition it is recommended to make sure Automatic updates are turned off for the device.

Questions AND **ANSWERS** FROM HARAV **AVIGDOR** MILLER ZATZA"L

#### Q: What do you think about the election of Carter to be our next President?

A: I haven't the slightest knowledge about Carter. But I hope that Hakodosh Boruch Hu will give Him His blessings and give him success. Now that he's been elected, it's a mitzvah to daven for Carter.

It's a mitzvah. You have to be *mispallel* b'shlom malchus; every Jew has to pray benefit of government. Now that he's been elected, we daven he should be well; he shouldn't catch a cold.

He shouldn't be bothered by the liberals. He shouldn't have any wars in his time. And ישכון לבטח וושראל יהודה וישראל (Yirmiyahu 23:6), in his time the Jewish people should be happy and prosperous and Moshiach should come. That's the best I can tell you.

And that's our duty, to pray for Carter. Every Jew has to pray for Carter. And you have to still pray for Ford by the way, because he's still President until January. So for the duration of his term you have to pray for him.

A Jew must pray for his government. It's very important. It's a mishna in Mesichta Avos (3:2); plain and simple we must pray for the government. And even if you haven't done it till now, it's a good time to begin. From now on think about it sometimes, and say it. Even when you're on the street walking, say a little prayer for the President and for the Vice-president, and don't be ashamed. Don't worry that you might be ridiculed by somebody - let nobody know about it. But you should know that you're doing the duty of an Orthodox Jew.

You must pray for the government! Not because you want to show the government that you pray for them. The fakers come together and wave flags, and they make an official prayer - that doesn't mean a thing. They're not praying for the government, they're just showing off. Pray for the government quietly between yourself and Hashem. And you should really mean it. Have in mind that Carter should be well and that he shouldn't have troubles. He shouldn't fight with his

wife. He should have peace at home and peace in the government. Congress should cooperate with him. There's no question that if there will be a tranquil government, then Carter will try to make a good name for himself. No question about it. Any President would like to make a regime that will go down in history as a successful regime. And so, our best wishes are given to

incumbent, President-elect Carter, and Hakodosh Boruch Hu should help him - and us. TAPE # 144 (November 1976)

#### Q: How does a person know if he is being stingy or just being careful with money?

A: If he is in doubt, let him should consult someone, a talmid chochom. Sometimes, he deceiving himself and he needs someone to point that out to him. Of course, you can't run to the *chochom* for every little thing; you have to use your judgment. If a person has a certain amount of ahavas Hashem and looking for mitzvos, and at the same time he has a certain amount of chochma, so the chochma and

the ahavas Hashem work together and give him an idea what he should do. But just to tell you from here, in a general way, how to control this middah, is not possible. You have to use your judgment based on the knowledge that you have to save your money, and you have to worry about your own family. And yet, you also you have to think about your duties in *gemilas chasodim* too. You have to come to some sort of compromise. Now, in case it is too difficult, so you consult a chochom to help you come to a decision. TAPE # E-91 (November 1996)

#### Q: Are there any objections to frum Jews playing state lottery games?

A: In Europe there were state lotteries, and it wasn't considered wrong, even for frum Jews, to buy a lottery ticket. However, some Jews go overboard with it and that leads to trouble. It's like drinking wine for kiddush. It's a good thing, but drinking too much wine, or drinking all the time, that's not so good.

What happens is that people start hanging around these places and putting all their money into it. You even have some fools who think they have perfected the system how to win; there are actually fools like that! I know all about it because I have to deal with them. I argued with one. His wife called me up, and she says that all their money is going down the drain in the lottery tickets. So I spoke to him and he told me he has a system! He's following a system and he's bound to win. Only that it didn't come yet; it's always right around the corner. A fool! TAPE # 491

#### Q: Should I buy a house in Eretz Yisroel?

A: And the answer is that you should buy a house in the place where you're making a living. To go to Eretz Yisroel and become a *schnoorer* doesn't pay. No, no. It doesn't pay. You must make a living. And therefore whether you buy a house or rent a house, make sure that you're in a place where you can make a living.

And you should always make sure to find a frum neighborhood. It's very important. *S'vivah*, environment, is everything. Not only for 1999)

your children but for you as well. People who live around a Yeshiva are different than people who live someplace else. You see tzitzis out. Everyone is wearing a black hat. Shabbos is a different kind of Shabbos. It's a different kind of life. It's very important to live in a frum neighborhood.
